The Hornet Museum welcomed a continued increase in Museum attendance through all avenues and we're grateful to be seeing anything near pre-COVID shutdown numbers. The whole crew has worked hard to achieve that resurgence and we're grateful to all who have visited, given, and joined as Museum Members.

Community engagement in our in-house events saw particular growth year over year with nearly 6,000 more people than in 2022 attending special programs such as our Veterans Day Anniversary celebration and our New Year's Eve educational fundraising. We were excited to see this positive response to our event updates and look forward to continuing to ensure that we provide and produce options that are of value and interest to the Bay Area community. I would also like to thank everyone who helped us make our events successful—the list is far too long but includes groups such as the Friends of the Nisei Veterans, the Hornet Memorial Squadron, World of Warships, Pacific Fine Foods, A-Town Agency, and many more including innumerable and wonderful guest speakers.

In addition to more visitors, we also saw more volunteers join our ranks which is deeply appreciated as we could not have done what we accomplished without their help. We now have about ten volunteers for every one staff member at the Museum and that support is tangible and has an incredible impact on the number of projects we were able to take on. Not only do our volunteer divisions support Museum activities, but they also are critical to our ability to maintain our historic ship.

While we have so much more work to do, the future looks bright and exciting for the Museum and our crew. We have new events for 2024 and I invite everyone to join us in preserving the legacy of USS *Hornet* so that we can serve the present and inspire the future!

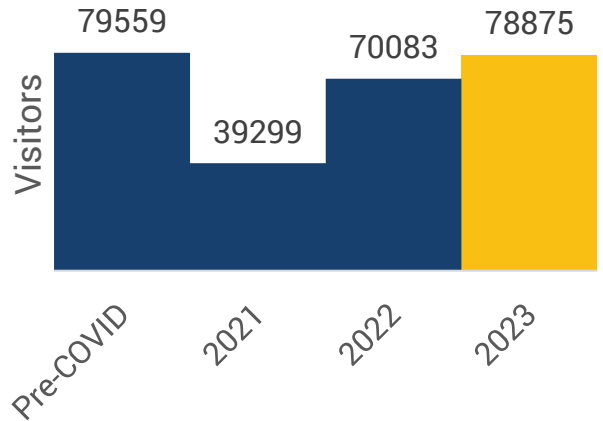


IMPACT

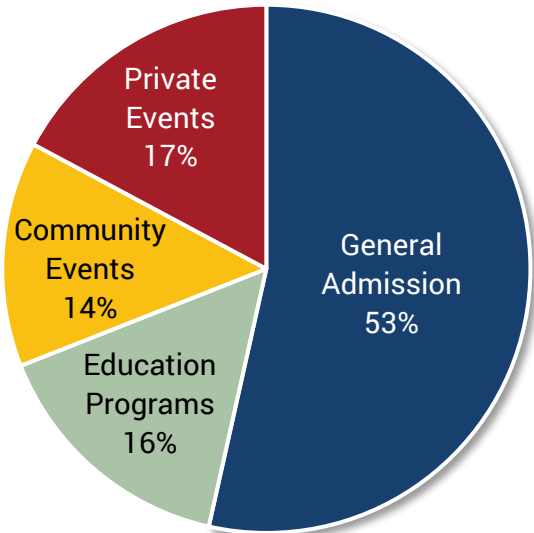
The Hornet Museum is seeing good growth out of our COVID impacted admissions and programming. This is due to new attention to Marketing as well as evaluating, improving, and “right-sizing” the events and programs that we offer so that the Museum is sure to deliver maximum impact in our mission outreach.

- Served about 12,000 people through our **Education Department** this year, which gets us back up to pre-COVID student attendance!
- Nearly 5,000 people attended [Veterans Day](#), which also commemorated the Museum’s 25th anniversary and USS *Hornet*’s 80th anniversary and featured Congresswoman Barbara Lee and Vice Admiral Daniel Dwyer.
- An increase of 6,000 more people attending our **Community Events** from last year, indicative of the Museum’s efforts to better market and collaborate for our events as well as to better match our mission-based programming to community interest.
- Our Collections & Exhibitions team installed a new permanent exhibit, **Asian Americans in the Military**, which focused on the stories of Asian Americans in all military branches and the challenges they faced and have overcome in their efforts to serve their country.
- The Museum hosted many **community partners** through 2023, including Paws for Purple Hearts, the National Park Service, SeaValor, Friends of the Nisei Veterans, East Bay Parks, the Walking Ghosts of Black History, Bataan Legacy Historical Society, Early Alert Canines, and others.
- **Hosting training opportunities for active military and first responders**, including the US Army Reserves, BAYEX (an interagency training exercise), the Alameda Fire Department, and the Alameda Police Department.
- **30% Growth in our Social Media** engagement, particularly the Museum’s [YouTube](#), and [TikTok](#) pages.

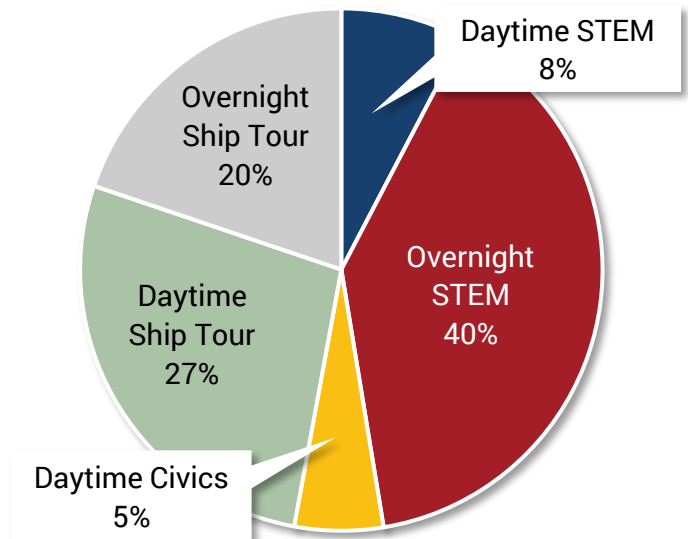
Museum Attendance

Added 300+ artifact records to our database.

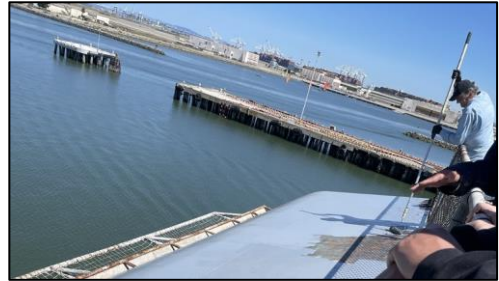


PRESERVATION AND RESTORATION

Aircraft carrier USS *Hornet* is the Hornet Museum's first and largest artifact, and work is never done on preserving and restoring her compartments and other spaces. The Museum thanks all those who gave specifically to our restoration efforts. 2023 was a busy year for our Engineers, and Ship and Aircraft Restoration volunteer divisions, with a focus on stabilizing the Flight Deck and other strategic preservation efforts.

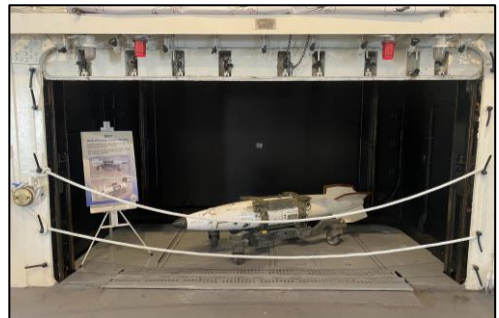

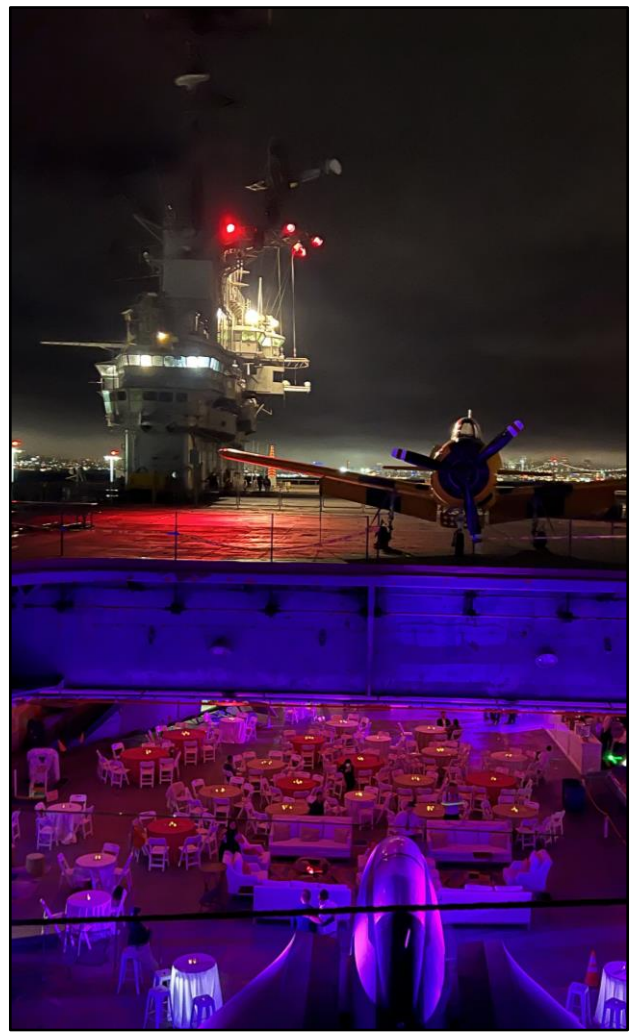

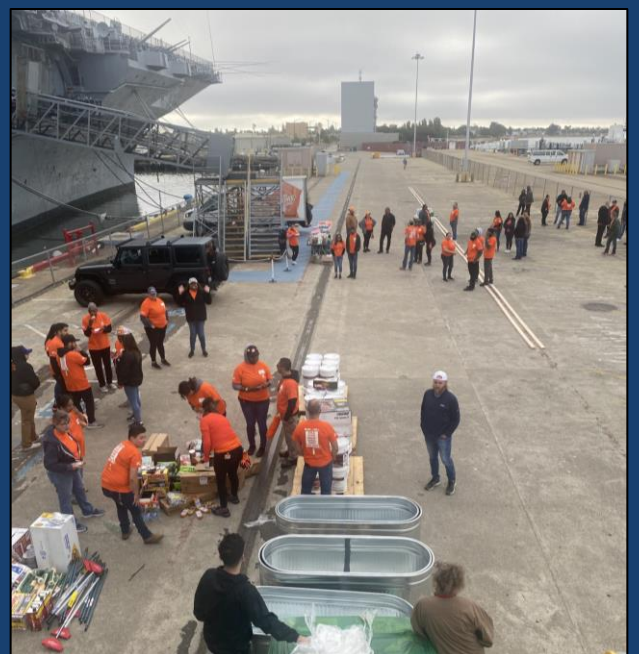
- Increasing Donor Communications

Corporate Engagement Spotlight: The Home Depot

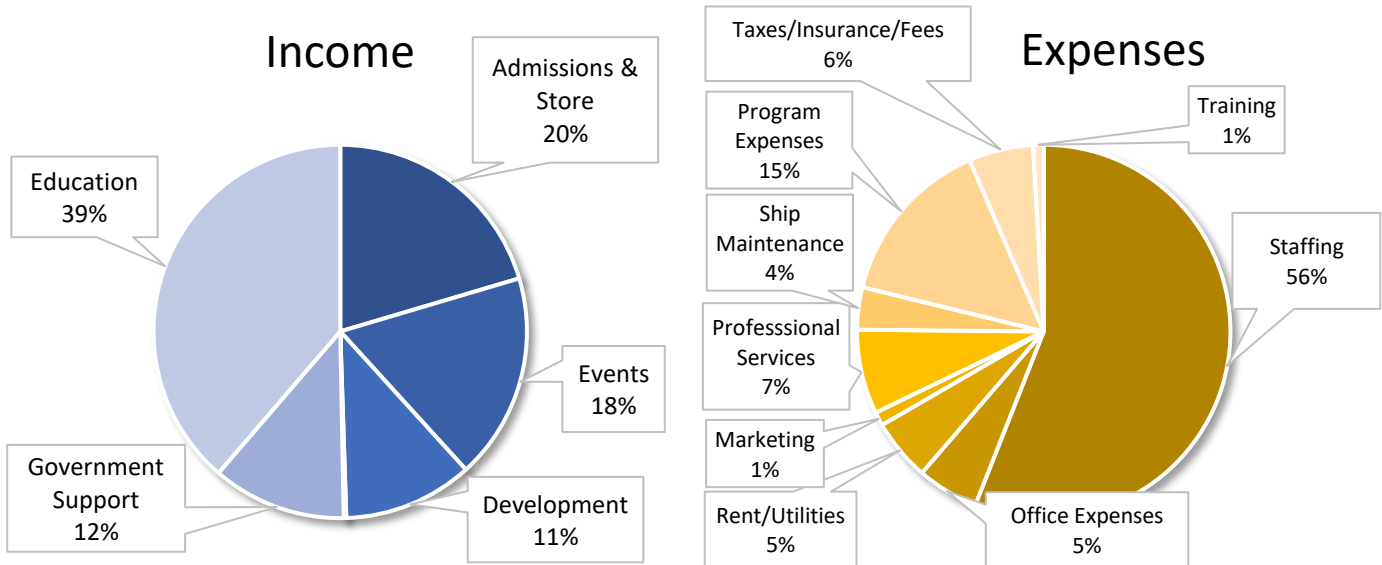
In July 2023, the Museum had the pleasure of having around 80 employees of Home Depots from around the East Bay join us for a community service project.

FINANCIALS

Due to the Hornet Museum's July – June fiscal year calendar, the following financials are from July 2022 through June 2023 rather than the 2023 calendar year.



Income:	\$3,767,839.56
Expenses:	\$3,684,490.13
Net Revenue:	\$83,349.13

Notable Financial Data Points

- Staffing remains the Hornet Museum's largest singular expense as our crew is the Museum's greatest asset and investment. This includes not only our 33 regular staff but also those who come in for our educational programming and events.
- The Government Support was the Employee Retention Tax Fund, which was awarded to the Hornet Museum as acknowledgment for our retaining staffing to as high a level as possible during the worst of the COVID shutdown in 2020.
- The Hornet Museum takes pride in working with local businesses whenever possible. In Fiscal Year 2022 – 2023, we chose to spend over \$520,000 locally, with a significant portion of those funds going specifically to businesses within the City of Alameda.
- The Museum's largest Private Event that we hosted in the last fiscal year was Rattleship, which was held on the final weekend of the fiscal year and brought around 5,600 people to the ship. Our highest attended Community Event during that same fiscal year was CarrierCon in March 2023 with around 2,000 attendees, though our New Year's Eve gala was the highest earning.
